

WEEK IN REVIEW

We reach the end of I Kings where we see the death of King Ahab. Ahab is known as the most wicked king in Israel's history and dies while being struck by a random arrow. What seemed like a crazy chance most likely was not an accident but the sovereign hand of God. We then head to 2 Kings, where we see a kingdom that is splintered and eventually **exiled**. To be exiled means to be taken from your home to a foreign place. This is what happens to God's people. Throughout this book, we will see the Northern Kingdom of Israel fall to the Assyrians Empire in 722 BC and the Southern Kingdom of Judah fall to the Babylonian Empire in 586 BC.

Prophets play a key role in the book of 1 and 2 Kings, and really throughout the rest of the Old Testament. The prophet Elijah is one of the most famous. We see Elijah miraculously part the Jordan River and then pass his role to a **prophet** named Elisha. As a reminder, a prophet is someone who proclaims God's word for both the present and the future. Elijah is taken up to Heaven in a whirlwind with a chariot of fire. Elisha takes over and asks God for a double portion of Elijah's spirit. In 2 Kings 4, we see Elisha perform many miracles. These included the widow's oil, the poisoned stew, and the feeding of one-hundred people. Elisha was performing all of these miracles by the power of God, so that God would receive the glory.

In 2 Kings 5, there is a famous story of a man named Namaan. Namaan was the commander of the Syrian army and was well-respected. However, Namaan had a big problem. He had a terrible skin disease called **leprosy**. Leprosy was a painful and embarrassing disease that had no cure. Namaan's wife had a servant who was a follower of the God of Israel. The servant girl suggested that Namaan should visit the prophet Elisha. Elisha took her advice and journey to Israel, which was considered the Syrian's enemies. When he arrived, Elisha did not come out, but sent messengers to tell Namman to bathe in the water seven times and then he would be healed. Even though Namaan hesitated, he went ahead and bathed in the river seven times. This would have been considered humiliating. However, it worked! Namaan was healed. Just like Namaan, God wants to offer us healing, not only physically but spiritually. Jesus is the one who heals us spiritually and makes us new!
