

WEEK IN REVIEW

This section begins with David being anointed as King of Israel. After years of waiting patiently on the Lord, David's time has come. The Lord said to David, "'You will shepherd my people Israel, and you will become their ruler." David was formerly a shepherd who took care of his flocks of sheep, but now he was a shepherd over the people of Israel. It tells us that David grew more powerful and that the **Lord of Armies** was with him. The Lord of Armies is a name used for God meaning that He is the commander of all heavenly armies (angels) and the ruler over all powers.

One of the key stories is about the movement of something called the **Ark of the Covenant** to Jerusalem so that God could be put back in His rightful place. The Ark of the Covenant is a special place that represents God's presence. They set the Ark on a new cart and rejoiced before the Lord with worship and sacrifices. The oxen that are pulling the cart stumble, and a man named Uzzah is struck dead for touching the **holy** Ark of the Covenant. To be holy is to be special and set apart. Our God is a holy one, and His holiness demands respect. This led to a fear and respect of God, and then they did it the right way. David instructed the people and said, "No one but the Levites may carry the ark of God, because the Lord chose them to carry the ark of the Lord and to minister before him forever." The Levites were the tribe that was set apart for the work of priestly duties.

After they brought the Ark of the Covenant to Jerusalem correctly, they celebrated! They had the horns, the trumpets, and the cymbals playing. They offered sacrifices as an act of worship. They even had cake! It was not the typical cake that we have, but date and raisin cake. They rejoiced and celebrated, just because the presence of the Lord was there! David even wrote a song of thanksgiving! He says, "Sing to the Lord, all the earth; proclaim his salvation day after day. Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous deeds among all peoples." God's presence is worthy of our celebration! Philippians 4 tells us to rejoice in the Lord always. We always have a reason to celebrate because of the faithful God we serve!
